Mr. Leonard Allen Sr., 73, of Fayetteville, NC departed this earthly life on July 26, 2025, in Fayetteville, NC

Mr. Leonard Allen Sr. was born on October 25, 1951, in Liberty, Mississippi to the Late Jessie and Nancy Allen.
